FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE**

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and competitors must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.

2) Information About Import and Export.of Horses

a) IMPORT

- i) At least 35 days before the date of shipment delegations should submit a detailed list of all the riders and grooms (including name, sex and passport number) and a detailed list of all the horses including name, sex, colour, breed, age and FEI passport number. Riders should also be FEI registered and their FEI ID included in the aforementioned list.
- ii) Approximately 32 days before shipment each country should notify in writing the name of the Horse Export Company in the country of origin. This export company is responsible for the fulfillment of export and re-exportation requisites which, according to Argentine legislation, should be complied with 30 days before shipment.
- iii) The Agent appointed in the country of origin should send copy of each horse's FEI Passport (cover page and horse diagram) at least 15 days prior to the date of shipment in order to meet Argentine customs and sanitary requirements. These documents should be faxed to 005411-4342.9556.
- iv) Every horse entering the country for the competition should bring the original sanitary document of the country of origin and the corresponding FEI passport.
- v) ANNEX I lists all sanitary requisites that should be met for the entry of horses into the Argentine Republic. During their stay in Argentina the horses will be tested as provided for in the SENASA (ARGENTINE NATIONAL ANIMAL SANITARY AUTHORITY) 617 regulation. All the vaccines required by the sanitary regulations should also be registered on the horse's FEI Passport.
- vi) Riders' saddlery shall be accompanied by a detailed list of all the packages indicating their contents and approximate weight of each. This list should be sent to us at least 15 days prior to the entry of the horses. This being an essential pre-requisite to avoid customs delays when the horses are returned to their countries of origin.
- vii) No horse fodder or drugs will be allowed into Argentina . The only food allowed would be that necessary to feed the horse/s during transportation and a First Aid Kit for emergencies.

B) EXPORT

- i) ANEX II encloses the return sanitary document which will be signed by the Argentine Sanitary Authorities provided the horses stay in Argentina does not exceed 30 days. Should a specific return sanitary

- document be needed, copy of it should be e-mailed to joseortelli@infovia.com.ar, as soon as possible so that it can be checked and authorized by the SENASA
- ii) On leaving the country the number and contents of the saddlery packages should be the same as at the entry.
 - iii) Should any horse remain in Argentina for more than 30 days it should be tested as many times as necessary and inspected once again. When the horses get back to their countries the SENASA shall issue a sanitary certificate which complies with the requisites of each country of origin. Each Team shall meet the expense of any extra costs derived from inspections and IAE tests.
 - iv) Should there be horses intended to remain indefinitely in Argentina, the rider and/or the owner shall meet the expense of the quarantine, the taxes and the corresponding nationalization proceedings.
 - v) No horse can be shipped back to its country of origin if the relevant NF has not settled its accounts with the Import Agent JOSA SA. Import and re-exportation expenses should be met by each participating country and the Organizing Committee will only meet the expense of transportation by road from Ezeiza to Campo de Mayo. In addition to the aforementioned and within their possibilities, the Organizing Committee will pay a fixed amount for the horses in each country's official team.

ANNEX I

Sanitary Requirements for Temporary Import of Horses into the Argentine Republic

1. Serum Tests

(Should be carried out within 30 days prior to the date of shipment of the horses, and should present negative results).

- 1) IAE, Coggins Test
- 2) Pyroplasmosis(Complement Fixation, Babesi Equi & Babesia Caballi)
- 3) Vesicle Stomatitis (New Jersey and Indiana viruses)

Vaccines (on dead viruses)

Equine Influenza
Equine Rhinopneumonia
East and West Encephalomyelitis

The sanitary certificate should indicate whether the horse has been vaccinated against the Nile Virus.

Treatment

Horses should be treated against endoparasites and ectoparasites.
