THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

- 1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
- 2. Horses and competitors must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
- 3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
- 4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
- 5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.

III. SPECIFIC TECHNICAL CONDITIONS

1. COMPETITION (Art. 820.821. 808. 806. 801)

By Team: Each nation can register a team made up of four members maximum who will also contribute as an individual competitor. The team must always be made up of competitors of the same nationality.

It is possible for a nation to register a team made up of three members. In this case, the results of the three competitors are taken into account for the final classification.

<u>Into individual</u>: The individual competitors are registered by their nation in accordance with F.E.I. status

Time limit: 12h05

<u>Starting method</u>: The competitors will leave in group in order to begin the race at the same time, and they will be recorded at the same time of departure.

Type of ground: The race will proceed on a varied, flat ground and hills (50% each one), with dirt roads / grass and stony ways.

Altitude differentials: The ground of the race is composed of alternations of dishes and hills with an uneven maximum of 150m. Altitude ranging between 103 and 282m

The competitors are authorized to carry the logo of the personal sponsor or the team on the carpet of saddle, in accordance with article 136 of FEI regulations.

7. THE RACE

A chart of the race will be consultable on www.event-pau.fr. The organizing committee keeps the right to modify the race. The final details will be exposed right before the race. Arrows will indicate the layout of the race. Chalk crosses on the ground will show the ways which should not be borrowed.

Will be indicated, the departure, the various dangers, the milestones (5km), the unauthorized points of assistance, the arrival and the kilometer before the finishing line.

No crewing is allowed during the last loop (assistance provided by the event organisers), (21km). Watering points for horses and riders will be available every 5 km of the course courtesy of the organizing team. Crewing cars are not allowed to leave the car park after the 3rd vet gate until the end of the race.

Any help by the team is prohibited in the last 2 kilometers of each stage. Any competitor taken to violate this regulation will be eliminated.

Varied, flat ground and hills (50% each one), with dirt roads / grass and stony ways.

The spurs are prohibited. Riding crops prohibited.
